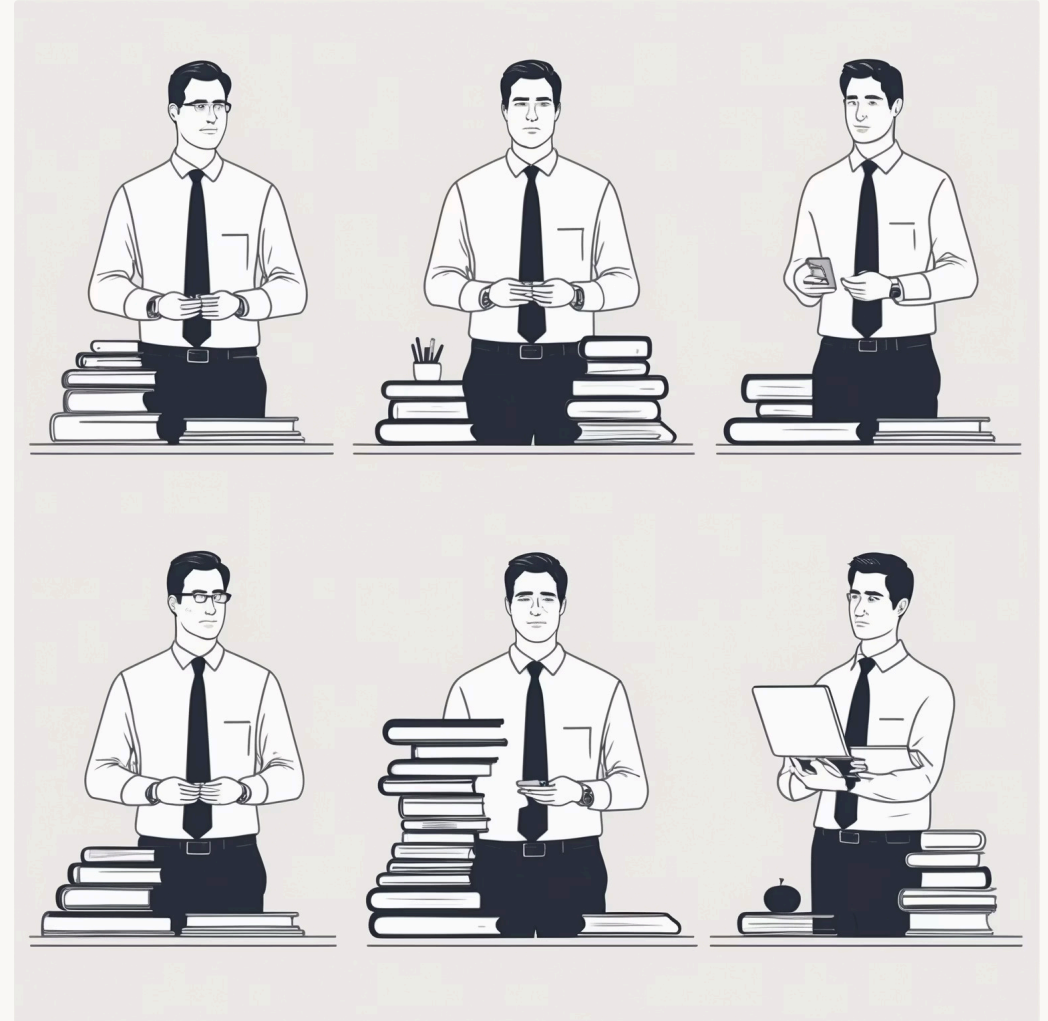

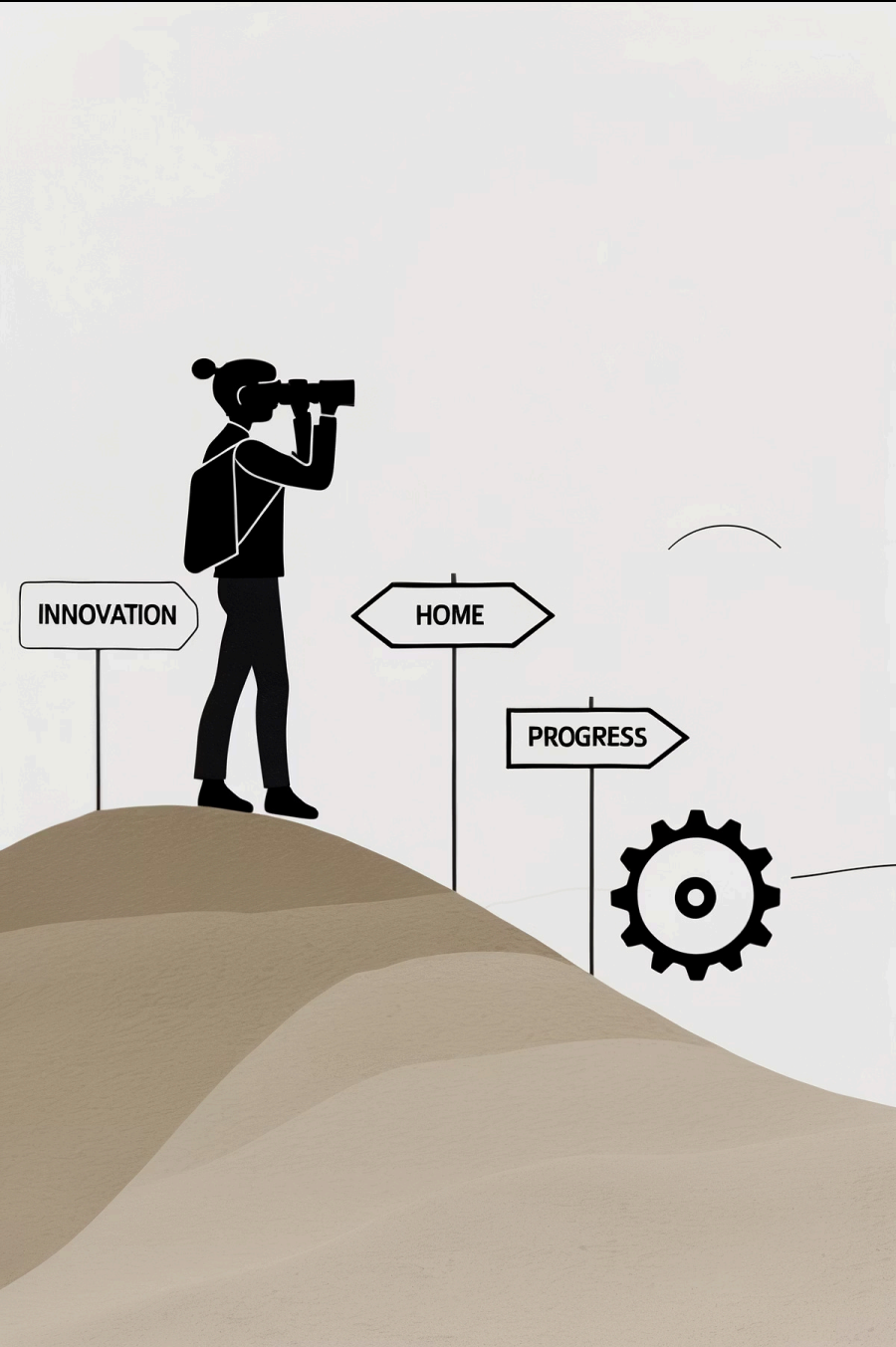

Nurture an insane optimism. Negativity kills innovation and momentum faster than any external threat.

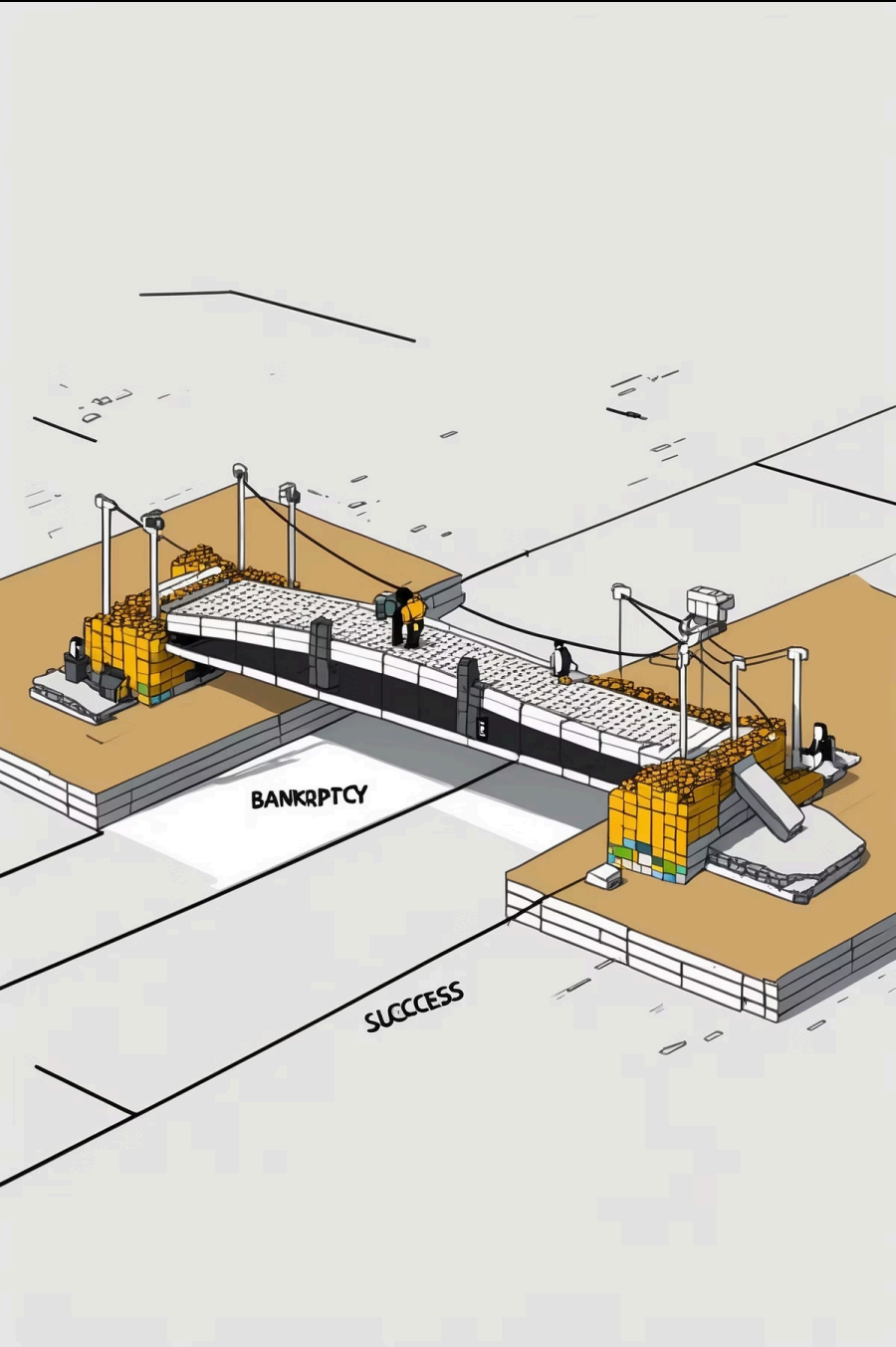
Embracing Risk and Learning from Failure

Procter & Gamble: 2008 Recession

- Ran countless micro-experiments with pricing and products
- Put in the effort to "fail fast, fail cheaply"
- Used small risks to find big opportunities

Each failure builds "**experiential capital**" — invaluable knowledge that can't be gained any other way.





LEGO's Transformation

LEGO transformed from near-bankruptcy by embracing the risky idea of crowdsourcing its product design.

That effort to learn from their own community fueled their incredible turnaround.

Aggressive Indecision

Inability to commit to a course of action

Organizational Sclerosis

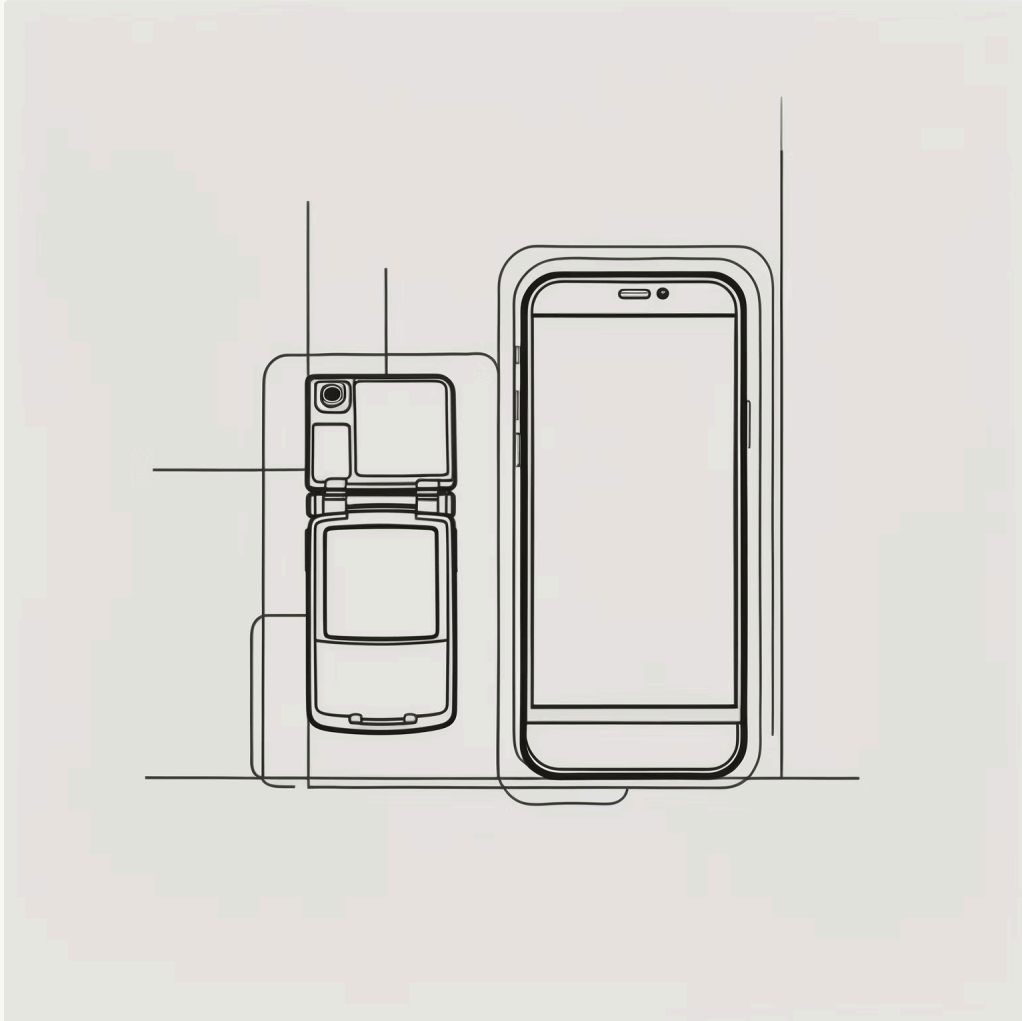
Rigid structures that resist change

Innovation Paralysis

Fear of failure preventing new ideas

While people chase imaginary secrets, they fall victim to these real killers of success.

Case Study: Motorola's Downfall



What Went Wrong:

- Became complacent with their success
- Lacked the effort to innovate beyond their hit Razr phone
- Paralyzed by internal politics
- Allowed the smartphone revolution to leave them behind

Cardboard People vs. Plasma People

Cardboard People

- Comfortable with their success
- Not putting in effort to understand the future
- Stuck in traditional retail mindsets

Plasma People

- Already busy creating the future of retail
- Embracing new technologies and approaches
- Taking action while others wait

Effort in Practice: Daily Habits



Deliberate Learning

Dedicate 20 minutes daily to learning something new in your field



Expand Your Network

Connect with one new person weekly who challenges your thinking



Reflection Time

Schedule weekly reviews to identify lessons from successes and failures

Overcoming Resistance to Effort

Common Barriers:

- Fear of failure
- Perfectionism
- Overwhelm
- Comfort with the status quo

Practical Solutions:

- Start with tiny steps
- Focus on progress, not perfection
- Build accountability systems
- Celebrate small wins

Remember: The effort itself builds momentum that makes future effort easier.




